- Students who attend the Governor’s School in 11th and 12th grades will have time in their schedule to take four (4) courses at Heritage, Denbigh, Menchville and Warwick High school(s) and three (3) courses at Woodside High school. It is recommended that students take PM classes at the Governor’s School.
- The Lunch/ travel schedule to the Governors school during 11th and 12th grades:
 1. Heritage and Warwick: 10:36 am to 11:24 am. (48 minutes)
 2. Menchville and Denbigh will be 10:50 am to 11:24 am. (34 minutes)
 3. Woodside will be 10:05 am to 11:24 am. (1 hour and 19 minutes)
- Newport News must assign credits for Governor’s School Courses in order to determine total credits earned.
- In order to earn an Advanced Studies Diploma, students must take at least three years of one world language or two years each of two different foreign languages.
