Course Description:

Cosmetology is an art, science, and a business. It is a program of clearly defined objectives and competencies intended to provide training in all phases of hair, nail and skin care. Students mastering standard state requirements will be eligible to sit for a state board exam and upon passing will be ready for immediate employment.

Prerequisites:

- Completion of, or enrolled in Biology or Chemistry
- Students enter this program in their junior year
- Must pass cosmetology I with a "B" or better to go to Cosmetology 2 their senior year.
- Manual dexterity
- Ability to follow instructions (oral and written)
- Hand eye coordination
- Stamina and willingness to spend long hours standing
- Skilled in human relations

Length of course: Cosmetology Barbering is a two-year course at New Horizons Regional Education Center.

Grading scale:

Quizzes and Test will be given at the end of each lesson. Lab or practical assignments will be graded daily. All work must be completed with 85% accuracy. A written exam will be given at the end of each semester. Cheating will result in an 0% for the assignment. Students will have two days upon returning to school to make-up work.

Special Projects:

Skills USA is a co-curricular club that permits you to compete with others in your district and state to determine your cosmetology/ barbering skills and leadership skills. Students must be enrolled in Skills USA to attend Cosmetology/barbering sponsored field trips.

Class Procedures:

- Must have supply kit for every class
- Student must be in smocks for all practical assignments
- Check duty list for cleaning assignments(sanitation)
- No eating, drinking or chewing gum in the practical area
- Comfortable closed toe shoes
- Please have a 3 ring binder paper and pen for each class
- **All students must have a signed release form by his or her parents before they may have any services performed on them in class.**

Classroom Rules and Regulations

1. No profanity.
2. No cell phones, I pods, cassette players, or electrical devices. Must be put away or will be taken at the beginning of class.
3. No eating or drinking on the Clinical side of the classroom.
4. No placing back packs, purses, books in the reception area or in the Clinical area of the class.
5. No leaving the classroom with out permission.
6. Students may go to the snack machine only at designated times unless permission is granted by the instructor.
7. Smocks must be worn at all time on the clinical floor.
8. No open toed shoes on the clinical floor.
9. At all Skills USA events business casual attire is required unless otherwise stated.

Boys(white shirt, black tie, black slacks) no jeans, tennis shoes, tee shirts, sweat pants, or tank tops.

10. Services may only be done when permission is granted by instructor.
11. Absolutely no horse playing on the clinical floor!!!!!!
12. Razors, shears or other sharp implements should not leave campus unless contained in school kit.
13. Correctly sit on furniture that is designed for sitting.
14. Students may not refuse to service a client.
15. A release form must be signed by a parent and returned before any student may be serviced.
16. The student that is not prepared for class with equipment or textbooks will receive a "0" for the day.
17. Rolling manicure chairs are not to be brought to classroom side.
